# ATTENDANCE

Our attendance figures here at Woodstone have certainly dipped over the past couple of years, just as they have in all other schools. We work hard at Woodstone to have attendance figures as close to 97% as possible, but this year we have sadly got nowhere near that target. As I say, this is the case across the country but the Government are now cracking down hard on poor attendance so I thought it was fair to warn parents/carers of the changes which will be on the way in the near future:

- The Government is changing who can have access to our attendance registers—basically the Local Authority AND the Government will have access to our registers and be able to take extracts from them i.e. see which children have unsatisfactory attendance
- The Government is proposing that it will no longer be down to Headteachers to decide whether to fine families either they will do it or the Local Authority. This will be for
  - children who have 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absences in a term
  - any unauthorised holidays in term time (almost all holidays in term time are unauthorised)
  - any unauthorised absences which occur shortly after an absence caused by illness
- The Government is also proposing that there will be a limit of two fines issued to parents before prosecution begins.

These are obviously quite hard hitting changes which parents need to be aware of. The Education Minister has pledged to really crack down on poor attendance and this will definitely impact on some of our families here at Woodstone. We already work closely with our Education Welfare & Attendance Officer, Naina Zavery, and some families will be receiving letters at the end of this academic year highlighting just how poor their child's attendance has been and encouraging a 'fresh start' in September.

#### **TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS**

Transition is crucial for children as it helps to put them at ease over the summer holiday and makes starting school a lot easier if they can put a name to a face or start to build a relationship with their new teacher and teaching assistant.
