As October draws to a close, I would like to extend my gratitude to all our families for their patience and endurance during these first weeks back at school after the summer, as we learn to live under these difficult circumstances. The children came back to school so positively and have settled back into their learning with a great attitude and the staff have done their very best to keep the school day as normal as it possibly can be. The Senior Leadership team and I have been busy drafting the priorities for the year ahead but our most important priority is to keep the children, staff and parents safe and to ensure the children are taught a broad and balanced curriculum throughout the year.

You will notice that each class we will be starting to bring homework home again – please encourage the children to do this (some may be set on line). At the moment it looks like all tests (Year 1 phonics, Year 2 SATs, Year 4 times tables tests and Year 6 SATs) will go ahead so we will continue to not only provide a broad and balanced curriculum but also ensure children are well prepared for these tests. There is a national campaign to have the tests scrapped due to the current situation but I will keep you informed should things change.

As we are unable to invite parents into school to share work/assemblies etc please keep an eye on the school website under the 'classes' tab where we will endeavour to give you a taste of some of the things happening in classrooms.

Since returning to school after the summer break we have had amazing attendance figures. Thank you to our families for trying your very best to get children into school each day. National attendance figures in primary schools currently stands at 89% whereas, as of today, Woodstone's attendance is 97.6%. This is fantastic and is currently above our target of 97%.

Attendance for the week beginning 12th October saw our Reception Class come out winners with 99.3%. Year 2 were second with 98.3% and Year 4 third with 97.2%. WELL DONE.
