Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, can I apologise for the late nature of this email. I had it all ready to send an hour ago when the whole Teachers2Parents system crashed nationally. Every school in England probably trying to use it at the same time I would imagine!

I am sure, like me, you have just watched the press conference from Downing Street announcing that schools will be returning to home learning until February half term. We all know this is far from ideal (and the timing is simply ludicrous) but we must all play our part in trying to reduce the cases and deaths caused by this hideous virus no matter how inconvenient it is for parents and school staff alike.

School will be closed to all pupils from tonight. This will enable staff to receive training in a new form of home learning, allow them to prepare quality, meaningful lessons to go online, set up the necessary technology and allow us to put systems in place for key worker provision. This will all start from **Wednesday 6th January**. Parents/carers will receive a detailed letter tomorrow highlighting this new, improved style of home learning and details on how to book children into the key worker group, should you fall into this category.
