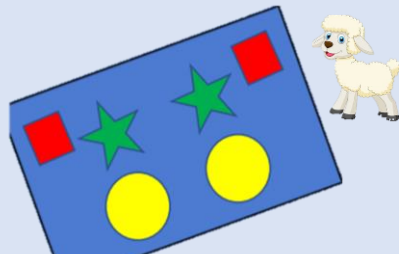


Mathematics

- *Practise counting up from 0 to 20 and back down from 20 to 0.
- *Listen to the days of the week song on Youtube-
<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3txOrvuXIRg> - see if you can listen and sing along. Discuss what day it is today, what day it was yesterday and what day it will be tomorrow.
- *Call out a number, can your child show you double using their fingers? E.g if you call out 2, can they show you 4?
- *Can you make your own pirate? - Fold your page in half - both sides of your flag must be the same (symmetrical).

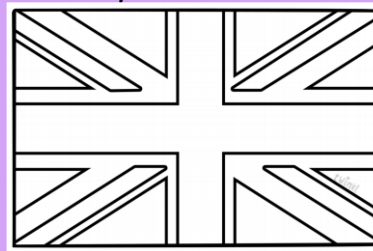
Good morning Reception! This week we are going to continue with our new topic is 'Do Cows Drink Milk?'. Can you have a go at these different activities.

75th Anniversary of VE Day

Victory in Europe

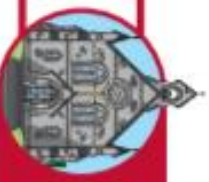
