Pupils hold doors open for adults. They display good manners in class and around school. Pupils are proud of their work and their school.


Pupils are mature and responsible.

We've had a couple of busy weeks - firstly we took part in Outdoor Education Day and then just a few days later it was anti-bullying week. The next couple of pages give a flavour of our activities...



ANTI-BULLYING WEEK

In our Reception Class for anti-bullying week they made a recipe for friendship, with the children even decorating cakes for a display.


Year 1 looked at what bullying is and discussed the small thing they can change to make a big difference for example letting someone join their games. They then looked at what makes a good friend and made a Recipe for the Perfect Friendship which also built on their instruction writing work.

Year 2 started by doing a self-evaluation of what it is to be a good friend. They also looked at similarities and differences and how we treat people with differences.

Year 3 focused on the #choosekindness campaign. They talked about what bullying is and then moved onto how they could make people feel better about themselves and the fact that we never really know what is happening in other people's lives. They then wrote down the names of every child in the class on posters and wrote positive words around them—they really saw the benefits of taking the time to say positive things to others.

Year 4 used the PowerPoint lesson from the anti-bullying website and talked about how 'Change Starts With Us'. They then created their own pledge wall to say how they were going to make a difference. (see photo on right)

Year 5 spent a lot of time discussing in teams what bullying meant, what anti-bullying meant and how to work together to stop any incidents of bullying. They created the posters below.





Finally, Year 6 arranged a Secret Angel Mission! This involved every child in the class having both a child and an adult who they had to be nice to. However, they had to also disguise this 'niceness' so that it wasn't obvious. They had to disguise it by being nice to everyone! The big reveal is this Thursday!
